## **Guidelines:**

- 1. The opportunities may be available by contacting the Girl Scouts of Hawai'i or by working with your Service Unit Manager. Service projects other than those listed on the back of this sheet may be initiated by a troop by seeking Service Unit Manager approval before beginning the project.
- 2. Participation in an Aloha Ambassador opportunity is not already recognized with another patch and should be beyond service to your sponsor.
- 3. An Aloha Ambassador troop must complete five approved projects. A girl/troop may purchase a patch and/or rocker after completing five projects. For example, in this year, if a girl/troop completes five projects, she will earn the patch; Next year, when she completes five more projects, she will earn the first rocker. Girls do not need to purchase a new badge and rockers when they transition to a new level. See below for a list of approved service projects.
- 4. To receive your patch(es), mail in Page 2 to the Girl Scouts of Hawai'i (Attn: Aloha Ambassador Program, 410 Atkinson Drive, Suite 2E1, Box 3, Honolulu, HI 96814). If you choose to have your order mailed, add \$2.00 for postage and handling to the total. You may also bring in page 2 to the Girl Scout Office located on the 2nd floor of the Ala Moana Hotel.
