



## ALICIA MOY

### President and CEO Hawaii Gas

Alicia Moy is the President and Chief Executive Officer of Hawaii Gas, the state's only government-franchised gas utility. At a time of dynamic change in the industry, she is transforming the 100-plus-year-old full-service gas company through visionary and progressive initiatives to reduce its dependence on oil for its production of feedstock. By the end of 2017, up to 30% of their oil-based fuel will be displaced with clean natural gas and by the end of 2018, the company will have added renewable natural gas to its 1,000-mile distribution pipeline on Oahu. This is the first project of its kind, and will use the raw biogas from the City & County of Honolulu's Wastewater treatment plant to create renewable natural gas. In addition, under her leadership, HG's family of companies invested in a solar farm on Oahu, supporting the positive transformation of Hawaii's energy landscape and achievement of the state's renewable energy goals.

Prior to coming to Hawaii, Alicia was senior vice president at Macquarie Infrastructure Corporation, a publicly traded company that owns, operates and invests in a diversified group of infrastructure businesses throughout the United States. For 12 years at Macquarie, Alicia oversaw corporate strategy, funding and management of several Macquarie-managed utility and energy companies. She worked on MIC's acquisition of Hawaii Gas in 2005 and 2006, and has served as a member of Hawaii Gas' board of directors since 2011. Alicia

started her career as an analyst in the Investment Banking division of Morgan Stanley, where she was involved in strategic planning and development, corporate finance and mergers and acquisitions.

An accomplished leader driven by excellence, Alicia graduated from the University of Miami with a bachelor's degree in finance and marketing, and earned a master's degree in finance from INSEAD, one of the top business schools in the world.

Alicia is a member of several professional, community and leadership organizations, including the Hawaii Business Roundtable and Young President's Organization. She serves on the boards of Aloha United Way, the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii and was most recently appointed by the Governor to serve on the board of the Workforce Development Council.

Alicia serves on the board of directors for Bank of Hawaii and for Macquarie Renewable Energy Holdings, a portfolio of several wind and solar generation facilities. She is also a member of the Omidyar Fellows Program.
