5 Points *Level 1*

1. Display “Join” Girl Scout materials at a Cookie Booth.
2. Encourage adults to like us @gsHawaii.
3. Make a 10-second video about why you love Girl Scouts and/or ways Girl Scouts has positively impacted your life and post it on social media #gsHawaii.
4. Wear a Girl Scout T-shirt out to the mall, grocery store, etc. Tell your story to those who ask.
5. Call, text or email 5 non-Girl Scout friends about Girl Scouts.
6. Troops or Service Units make an event “bring-a-friend” and provide patches.
7. Let others know facts about Girl Scouts they may not have known; for example, that girls can travel through the Destinations program.
8. Proudly wear your Girl Scout pin throughout Girl Scout week.
9. Use chalk and decorate your driveway or sidewalk with Girl Scout pride.
10. Share a flyer advertising a recruitment event at a business or public space in the community. Request flyer from customer care@gshawaii.org.



10 Points *Level 2*

1. Invite a non-Girl Scout friend (girl or adult) to a Girl Scouting activity.
2. Take-action in the community through service. Send pictures and stories to Council to share with local media. Submit your story details through the link.
3. Create your own “Ten reasons to be a Girl Scout” and post it in your community.
4. Do a good turn. Demonstrate 3 acts of kindness wearing your Girl Scout uniform.
5. Distribute flyers about stepping up to volunteer to adults. Request flyer from customer care@gshawaii.org.

Level 2 Cont.

6. Share a recruitment event opportunity to your Service Unit leaders.
7. With the help of an adult, pass out Girl Scout SWAG at a local farmer's market.
8. Ask your principal if you can pass out Girl Scout SWAG like stickers or pencils afterschool.
9. Volunteer to be greeters at your local church, temple or synagogue.
10. Ask your school or local library to showcase the great things your Troop has done on their bulletin board.



15 Points *Level 3*

1. Work with your parents to safely decorate your car in the theme of Girl Scouts, drive around your community with your decorated vehicle.
2. Wear your Girl Scout vest, sash, or tunic while participating in an outdoor event like hiking or camping and then share with friends or on social media #gsHawaii why you love getting outside and how Girl Scouts helps.
3. Collect books to donate to your school. Include "Donated by Girl Scout Troop XXXX" on the inside cover!
4. Send hand-written invitations to at least 5 non-Girl Scout friends and invite them to a Girl Scout activity.
5. Have your Troop lead the pledge of allegiance at your school.
6. Volunteer to lead the flag salute at your next City/County Council Meeting.
7. Plan a uniform day and ask all Girl Scouts to wear their uniforms to school or a community event on the same day – bonus incentivize participation with a patch or entry into a drawing.
8. Create a display of your Girl Scout journey and experiences to share at local fairs and community events.
9. Write a letter to the editor of the local paper about why Girl Scouting is important in your community.
10. Make a list of 25 "good turns" a girl in K-3 might carry out. Share it at your school or ask if you can read it during morning announcements at your school.



20 Points *Level 4*

1. Collaborate with other Girl Scouts to create and host a community service event in your community.
2. Host a Girl Scout “Try-It” experience - a mini activity for new girls and their caregiver(s).
3. Host a read-a-long day at your local library wearing your Girl Scout uniform.
4. Set up a Girl Scout booth during parent/teacher conferences at your school.
5. Connect with a sister Troop in your Service Unit to host a “Girl Scout Day” in your community.
6. Host a sing-a-long at your local park wearing your Girl Scout uniform.
7. Host a “wrapping party” to wrap GS sticker or messages around mini candies or make small treat bags with a GS sticker and other GS SWAG to pass out an event such as a parade, market, Halloween, etc.
8. Host a Girl Scouts-themed cupcake or cookie decorating challenge with your friends/family and share the results—the only limit is your creativity!
9. Plan a Girl-Scout-themed field day at your local park and advertise at schools and in the community.
10. Make and distribute 50 business cards to share with prospective Girl Scouts in your community. Share why Girl Scouting is fun, and list an adult’s contact information and information about Council activities.
11. Sign up your Troop or Service Unit for a local parade: Chinese New Year, Pride, Fourth of July, Kamehameha Day, Veterans Day, etc wearing Girl Scout uniform and attire.
12. Select a park in your community to host a beautification project event.
