GIRL SCOUTS OF HAWAI'I ANNOUNCES 2018 WOMEN OF DISTINCTION
Female Leaders to be Honored at Annual Dinner

HONOLULU (January 11, 2018) – Each year, the Girl Scouts of Hawai'i's Women of Distinction Dinner brings together future leaders and three of our state's most distinguished women to share their inspiring messages and stories. On Friday, March 9, the Girl Scouts of Hawai'i will honor Catherine Camp, Alicia Moy, and Denise Hayashi Yamaguchi at its 2018 Women of Distinction Dinner.

"It's always an honor to recognize and celebrate the incredible women who are making a difference in our community," said chief executive officer Shari Chang. "All three women embody what it means to be a G.I.R.L – a go-getter, innovator, risk-taker and leader."

Camp is Director of Planning and Development of Kamehameha School's Commercial Real Estate Department managing the organization's real estate planning, development, and asset management activities in key strategic markets comprising over 3 million square feet. She is also an active community member serving on the Child & Family Service Board of Directors, a Board Member of the Girl Scouts, and a Trustee at Palama Settlement. She has also been past president for the boards of the Mediation Center of the Pacific, Hawaii Developers Council, and Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies.

Moy is the president and chief executive officer of Hawaii Gas, the state's only government-franchised gas utility. At a time of dynamic change in the industry, she is transforming the more than a century-old, full-service gas company through visionary and progressive initiatives to reduce its dependence on oil for its production of feedstock. She is a member of several professional, community and leadership organizations, including the Hawaii Business Roundtable and Young President's Organization. She also serves on the boards of Aloha United Way, the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii and was most recently appointed by the Governor to serve on the board of the Workforce Development Council. Additionally, Moy is on the board of directors for Bank of Hawaii and for Macquarie Renewable Energy Holdings, a portfolio of several wind and solar generation facilities, and a member of the Omidyar Fellows Program.

Yamaguchi is the CEO and Founder of the Hawai'i Food & Wine Festival and also serves as the Executive Director of the Hawai'i Agricultural Foundation. Prior to her tenure with the Festival and with the Foundation, she was a business development consultant providing nonprofit and for-profit organizations with fund development,

marketing, government affairs, public relations and community relations strategies and solutions. She is currently a board member of the East-West Center Foundation and a member of the Hawai'i Tourism Authority Board of Directors and has held various volunteer leadership roles with a number of nonprofits in the community.

The 2018 Women of Distinction Dinner will feature a silent auction, gourmet meal, and other exciting activities, with scouts leading the event. All proceeds from the event remain with the Girl Scouts of Hawai'i council, and benefits local Girl Scout initiatives designed to help girls discover their potential and take action in their communities.
