**GIRL SCOUTS OF HAWAI'I PARTNERS WITH DESIGNER SIG ZANE
FOR LIMITED-EDITION CENTENNIAL ANNIVERSARY SCARF**

HONOLULU (FINAL) –Girl Scouts of Hawai'i has unveiled a limited-edition scarf exclusively designed by Sig Zane in honor of its 100th anniversary. First made available at the 100th Anniversary Celebration and 2017 Women of Distinction Dinner, the centennial anniversary scarves are now offered to the public.

“We’re so excited to partner with the talented Sig Zane and unveil our limited-edition scarves to the public,” said chief executive officer Shari Chang. “Only 100 scarves will ever be printed, and we couldn’t imagine a more fitting way to celebrate our 100th anniversary than by offering this gorgeous and meaningful design to the public.”

The 100th anniversary scarf design depicts the pua kalaunu, or crown flower, which was a favorite of Queen Liliuokalani, who sponsored the first two troops in Hawai'i. A lei of 100 pua kalaunu is symbolic of the first century of Girl Scouts of Hawai'i.

“This watermark of one hundred blossoms represents the 100 years of Girl Scouts of Hawai'i,” said art director Brandy Alia Serikaku. “Pua means flower, but it also means a decendent or a child, and this too represents the girls who are a part of the organization.”
