Do you remember selling your first package of cookies? Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors are invited to become a superhero to first time cookie sellers! Share what you know and earn service leadership hours too!

- Receive training that includes lots of fun games and activity ideas

Cookie Captains who complete 10 hours of cookie volunteer service will earn the Cookie Captain patch or year rocker, annual Cookie Entrepreneur Family Pin, and certificate.

Cookie Captains who complete 10+ service hours, lead a station at Cookie University, support a Cookie Booth for an ASLP troop*, and sell 250+ cookies will be invited to the Cookie CEO event scheduled for May 2024. Cookie Captains must submit the Service Hours form by the designated deadline to be eligible.

*After School Leadership Program (ASLP) Troops are council-led troops on all islands. The council cookie team can connect you directly with an ASLP Troop in your area.

Cookie Captain Job Description

The **Cookie Captain Program** provides service-oriented Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors the opportunity to mentor younger Girl Scouts and/or first-time Cookie sellers in the art of

selling Girl Scout Cookies. As a Cookie Captain, you can impact the Girl Scout Community by sharing your cookie experiences with younger Girl Scouts. At Cookie Captain training, you will learn how to hone the leadership skills that are already inside of you and teach younger Girl Scouts about the 5 skills of Selling Cookies: Goal Setting, Decision Making, Money Management, People Skills and Business Ethics. You will learn to use technology to create marketing tools, brainstorm fun ways of teaching other Girl Scouts cookie selling skills and receive a Cookie Toolkit to help you with your work. You will also learn about cookie-related service opportunities that you can attend throughout the Cookie Season and how to log hours toward your Cookie Captain completion.

To Be A Cookie Captain, A Girl Must:

Be a Girl Scout! Be a Girl Cadette, Senior or Ambassador registered with

Girl Scouts of Hawai'i

Be a seller! Have a basic understanding of the Girl Scouts of Hawai'i

Cookie Program and have participated in a Cookie Sale.

Be positive! Have an enthusiastic, positive attitude and be ready to

have FUN!

Be prepared! Complete Cookie Captain Training to learn to mentor! Ask

a mentor for help! Have completed at least one LIA award

before the end of the current Cookie season.

Be a mentor! Mentor a troop through the Cookie Program. This should

include helping a troop leader with training the girls and/or participate in an in-person or virtual booth sale

with them.

Be a volunteer! Help at Council or Service Unit cookie events.

Be accountable! Log all hours spent mentoring and volunteering at Cookie

Events. Turn in your hours log at the end of the program.

Be a leader! As a returning Cookie Captain, you can help others plan

cookie events and help train the new Cookie Captains.
